SUNDAY 20 SEPTEMBER 2015 – TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

Today is Home Mission Sunday, a day when Catholics in England & Wales are invited to pray for and support financially the missionary work of the Church in our country. When I was a child, I sometimes used to daydream about being an intrepid missionary, going off to some far-away country in Asia or Africa to preach the Gospel to those who had never heard it. I was mistaken about what being a missionary meant. Actually, all Christians, by virtue of their baptism, are called to be missionaries, and all the places Christians find themselves – work place, home, where they socialise – form part of mission territory. So, for you, your work place or your home in this coming week is where you are called to preach the Gospel by word and deeds. Doing your job as well as you can for love of God is mission work.

At the end of each Mass, we are dismissed with the words "Go in peace", or "Go forth, the Mass is ended", or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life", or "Go and proclaim the Gospel of the Lord". All of these phrases are an attempt to translate the words of dismissal in Latin, "Ite, missa est", from which we get the English word "mission". We are sent forth at the end of Mass, not to keep the Good News of the Gospel to ourselves, but rather to share the Joy of the Gospel with others.

Blessed Paul VI once wrote that the Church is missionary by her very nature. It is not the case that the Church has a mission, rather the Church **is** mission, she is sent by her Lord and Head to continue His work of salvation. Right from the beginning of his pontificate, Pope Francis has challenged us to be less concerned with internal, "churchy" things (it can so much more comfortable to talk about who ought to do what ministry) and to be more concerned with evangelisation, looking outwards, bringing the joy and peace of the Good News of salvation to those whom we meet. He once said that an inward-looking Church is a sick one, a Church that has lost her identity, her sense of mission and purpose. What is true of the Church as a whole, is true of each parish and each individual Christian.

For the past three years, Bishop Philip has been calling our Diocese of Portsmouth to respond to the challenge of the New Evangelisation, a proclamation of the Gospel that is new in its ardour, its methods and its expression. It is a task for each and every one of us, in a way appropriate to our gifts and talents. Please pray each day for the New Evangelisation of our country.
