A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JAMES,

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you can see from the information above and overleaf, in the year ended 31 August 2025, because we had ordinary receipts in addition to the offertory, we had an average of £91 left over at the end of each week to cover unexpected day to day costs. This limited surplus does not place us in a strong financial position. To ensure we can continue meeting our regular operational needs - especially in light of rising costs and the need to maintain essential services - it is vital that we strengthen our financial reserves. While the surplus from our 'extraordinary' receipts may suggest that the cathedral is in a stable financial position, it is important to note that relying on this surplus to cover routine operational costs is neither sustainable nor responsible stewardship, especially in the light of the need to spend £2.5 million in the near future on necessary repairs to the cathedral building. A detailed breakdown of our current financial position and future needs, including 'extraordinary' receipts and payments, is available in the accompanying leaflet.

I know you to be a caring and giving community. Please support your Christian household of faith here so that we can be resilient for whatever will come our way and fulfil our commitment to the Diocesan Mission.

I ask everyone to reflect prayerfully on their commitment to our parish, why it is important and how each of us can support that commitment to ensure we leave a sustainable legacy for those who follow us.
